Summer projects are opportunities for students to take the good news of forgiveness in Jesus to virtually anywhere in the world with Cru. No matter the length or ministry focus, the summer projects are about life change and bringing the Gospel to those who haven't heard. These trips offer training and ministry experience for the students to then bring back to campus, and in their communities after graduation. On project, along with 20-150 other students, students experience the urgency for the Gospel in a way they may not see or experience back home.

Forty-three students from central Wisconsin attended a summer project. Not only did these students grow in confidence as they developed their relationship with the Lord and how to communicate the message of the Gospel, but they also grow in confidence as they come back home and talk to people in their communities. It is truly about being 100 percent sent for a lifetime.

When we were students, we attended projects both here in the United States and abroad in the Middle East and East Asia. This summer, two of our fellow staff members in central Wisconsin -- Jordan and Erin -- led trips to Montevideo, Uruguay and Ghana, Africa. Thank you for praying for their teams and the individuals the Lord placed in their paths. Here are some updates from their adventures.

Uruguay

The very first day we were on campus, two Uruguayans, Gabriel and Pablo, heard we spoke English, so they sat down and talked to us for two hours! We became fast friends and later their other friend, Fabian, also joined them at nearly every Cru function we had. On one of the holidays, Aaron (a student here at UW-Stevens Point) and Jordan, took Fabian to Burger King and focused on Law 4 of the Knowing God Personally (KGP) booklet which says, "We must individually receive Jesus as Savior and Lord; then we can know God personally and experience His love and plan." After discussing it for awhile, Fabian wanted to pray with us to put Christ on the throne of his life. We didn't know what that truly meant at the time, but on our last day in Uruguay, he came up to both of us and told us he would never forget our conversation at Burger King. Both he and Pablo had indicated that they prayed to receive Christ by the end of project. We are praying they stay involved with student movement in Uruguay and grow in their walk with Christ.

Another student we met on project was Angel. Erik (another student here at UW-Stevens Point) met him solely through the love of Christ. He saw Angel across campus, smiled and waved at him, even though he'd never met him. Angel thought this was such a loving thing that he then came up an hour later and talked to Erik! A week later, while eating lunch, Erik asked Angel if he wanted to hear his story. Angel said yes and was very moved by it, and afterwards Erik asked what his story was. He said that he drank, did cocaine, had sex, and partied, but none of it gave him satisfaction. We then asked him if he wanted to know more about God. While talking about God he grew happier, becoming more and more excited to accept Christ into his

life. We went through the KGP booklet, and he was so excited that by the end he was reading it to Erik! He decided to pray to receive Christ -- he was happy and excited. Angel said he loved them and called Erik and his friend "brothers." Even in just the few weeks they were able to pour into Angel, he was already making decisions to change his life. God truly worked through them to get to Angel.

Ghana

During the first two weeks of the project, the students and staff partnered with local churches to reach-out to people of all ages in many small villages. Those outreaches included outdoor presentations of the JESUS Film. Based on the Gospel of Luke, the JESUS film has now been translated into 1,145 languages, with new languages being added every month. This allows God's Word to speak to people in more than 200 countries in languages they know and understand. The team shared the JESUS film in 38 locations along with sharing the Gospel in 24 villages. Praise the Lord! The final two weeks of project they were on campus sharing Christ with college students in partnership with the local Cru ministry.



Here is their report of God's work the first two weeks:

Evangelism: 1,521 one-on-one gospel presentations, 490 decisions for Christ, 292 received a follow-up meeting to discuss their faith.

Three Senior High visits: 604 exposed to the Gospel, 435 decisions for Christ

Jesus film: 9,368 exposed to the film with a testimony and Gospel presentation, 952 decisions for Christ, 88 received a follow-up meeting to discuss their faith.

Overall: 11,493 exposed to gospel, 1,877 decisions for Christ, 330 received a follow-up meeting to discuss their faith.

Praise the Lord for all He did and continues to do in Ghana, Africa.
